FIVE

Engaging a broad audience through our online campus; which allows a diverse group of people to explore faith, their relationship with God and grow in spiritual maturity in Christ.

SIX

Continuing to take Holy Spirit inspired courageous steps of faith as we prayerfully pursue God's call upon our lives.

SEVEN

Planting and partnering with like-minded churches, both locally and globally, to advance a disciple-making movement, with the understanding that we are always better together.

OUR MINISTRY STRATEGY

Jesus' model of ministry clearly shows us the best way to make disciples is in real relationships.

WHAT IS A DISCIPLE?

We frame our definition of a disciple or a fully devoted follower of Christ around Matthew 4:19. "Come, <u>follow me</u>," Jesus said, "and <u>I will make</u> you fishers of men."

This verse provides the framework for the three key parts we find in the New Testament on what it means to be a disciple. A disciple is one who:

- 1. Is "following" Christ (**HEAD Response**) and has made Jesus Lord of their life.
- Is being "transformed" by Christ (HEART
 Response) and is becoming like Christ in attitude
 and action; and
- 3. Is "committed" to the mission of Christ (**HAND Response**) in this world.

Based on those three parts, our definition of a disciple is:

A <u>FOLLOWER</u> OF JESUS WHO IS BEING <u>TRANSFORMED</u> BY HIM AND IS <u>COMMITTED</u> TO HIS MISSION.

Knowing that God has wired us for relationship, we are committed to the task of **BEING** and **MAKING** disciples of Jesus using the strategy of relational environments. We make disciples that make other disciples in this manner because Jesus did it that way. As we read through the Gospels and study the ministry strategy of the early church, we note there are different relational vehicles for helping us grow and mature as disciples of Christ. We describe these relational vehicles in the following way:




TRAIN = LOCAL CHURCH (ACTS 2:42-47)

BUS = MINISTRY PROGRAMS / EVENTS (ACTS 6:1-6)

VAN = LIFE GROUPS (LUKE 9:1-10)

CAR = ONE-ON-FEW (MARK 9:2)

MOTORBIKE = SIDE-BY-SIDE (JOHN 3:1-8)
